Regular Meeting Minutes

CALL TO ORDER: Chairman S. Young called the meeting to order at 7:30pm

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: A motion was made by 2nd Vice Chairman V. Young, seconded by R. Johnson, to approve the LLA June 2 , 2026 Meeting Minutes as presented.

INTRODUCTION OF GUESTS: Chairman S. Young introduced R. Winninger, Marine Patrol, and J. Francis, FOTL

CORRESPONDENCE: Chairman S. Young reported receiving correspondence regarding aquatic weed treatment, FirstLight Power, regarding a noticed statement of the Town's waterbodies – water awareness.

OFFICER REPORTS:

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT: Chairman S. Young stated it has been a struggle to get Pond and Lake to do what they have to in order to notify the public of weed treatment. The postings did not have the right areas circled that were to receive treatment and there were mistakes on mapping. He also stated that in the month of June the generation in our dam was offline. FirstLight Power will not be generating power in the lake until December. Bantam Lake Authority and the Town of Morris, another Lake Authority, are actively pursuing banning wake boarding boats.

FIRST VICE CHAIRMAN'S REPORT: No Report for this meeting.

SECOND VICE CHAIRMAN'S REPORT: 2nd Vice Chairman V. Young stated that the weed treatment that was performed at Lillinonah Drive was successful.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Treasurer B. Woerner that invoices coming in for services.

LAKE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE: No report for this meeting.

GRANT COMMITTEE: No report for this meeting.

LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE: M. Digirolamo provided two updates on clarification on Rapid Response Hydrilla Law (Public Act 26-75), and Act Concerning Certain Boating Regulations (prohibition on Extending Limbs Over A Vessel's Gunwake While In Operation: Contact Information to be Marked on Unregistered Vessels (e.g. Paddle boards, Canoes and Kayaks, etc. and New Rules for Abandoned Vessels). (Public Act 26-60).

COMMUNICATION AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY COMMITTEE: J. Ginnetty stated that herbicide treatment calls were as follows; 578 Lake Alert @ \$75per call. There were 33% live, 49% voicemail, and 15% busy no answer page for marine patrol.

BOAT AND SAFETY COMMITTEE: R. Winninger, lake patrol, reported that Boat #2 is non- operational. Russ said that they have come up with a working plan to cover the patrol shifts with two boats.

FISH STOCKING COMMITTEE: No report for this meeting.

ANY OTHER ITEMS TO BE DISCUSSED: J. Francis, FOTL, reported that the next Hydrilla treatment will be in the next couple of weeks. He also reported that Kimberly Clark does not do any bypass for maintenance. J. Francis stated that the buoys have been updated with sensors and anchors.

ADJOURNMENT: A motion was made by J. Ginnetty, seconded by R. Johnson to adjourn the meeting. Motion carries unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 8:05pm.
